

A **one year program** (max 4yrs part-time) for persons who are graduates in a non-theological discipline, with a balance of 7 core and elective units that allow for variety of interests and study goals, plus a project integrating theological study and professional life.

### **4 Core Foundational Units:**

Chosen from:

- Formative Old Testament Traditions (from Genesis to the time of Elijah)
- From Israel to Judea (from 8<sup>th</sup> century prophets, to post-exilic literature)
- The Content and Setting of the Gospel Tradition
- The Early New Testament Church
- Early Church History (30-451)
- The Church from 1550 to Modern Times

### **2 Theology units:**

Chosen from:

- The Doctrine of God and the Work of Christ
- Doctrines of Grace & Eschatology
- Church, Sacraments and Ministry
- MA units in Theology (700 level; double unit)
- Reformation Issues
- Theology Seminar

### **1 Elective:**

Any of the above Theology units or advanced level units such as:

- OT and NT exegesis units
- Chaplaincy in Education Settings
- Christian Apologetics
- Christian Faith in Society
- Pastoral Skills and Methods
- Introductory Preaching
- Foundations of Pastoral Care
- Intro to Christian Ethics
- Church Dynamics and Growth
- Living Faiths
- Principles of Leadership & Management

### **Integrated Project (5,000 words):**

An opportunity for sustained research integrating professional and life interests with particular aspects of the Christian tradition in which a grounding has been laid in earlier stages of the course.
